Keynote Speaker Biographies

Héctor Garza, Ed.D, M.P.H.

President, National Council for Community and Education Partnerships

Héctor Garza, a native of Edinburg, Texas, serves as the founding president of the National Council for Community and Education Partnerships (NCCEP). NCCEP is a national non-profit organization dedicated to the principle that every child deserves an equal chance at obtaining a quality higher education. NCCEP's goal is to bring together colleges and universities with local schools, parent groups, government agencies, foundations, corporations, and community-based organizations to work collaboratively to improve student achievement and expand educational opportunities for all of America's children.

Prior to founding NCCEP, Dr. Garza served as the Vice President for Access and Equity Programs at the American Council on Education (ACE) in Washington, D.C. for six years. Dr. Garza served as a senior consultant to the Ford Foundation on K-16 initiatives, and during the past ten years has served a similar role on behalf of the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. Ann B. Stiles

Executive Director, Project GRAD Houston

Ann B. Stiles serves as the Executive Director of Project GRAD Houston (GRAD), where she leads GRAD's Pre-K through 12 college access education reform model. Working collaboratively with the Houston Independent School District, this initiative serves approximately 45,000 children and their families. Prior to becoming Executive Director, Ms. Stiles served in various leadership roles for GRAD Houston and GRAD USA, the national arm of the organization.

Ms. Stiles entered education as a second career in 1993, where she was a fifth-grade HISD teacher. Prior to this, she held leadership positions in accounting and finance, in the energy and international transportation industries. Ms. Stiles holds a B.A. and a M.Ed. degree, magna cum laude, from the University of Saint Thomas.

Dr. Max Castillo (invited)

Retired President of the University of Houston-Downtown

Max Castillo served as the President of the University of Houston-Downtown, one of four independent universities in the University of Houston System. During his tenure, the University enrollment grew to more than 12,000 students and expanded its campus from one to five buildings on the northern edge of Houston's vibrant downtown business district. UHD is known for providing access and opportunity to a very diverse and talented student body and offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in fields facing growing demands for an educated and trained workforce.

Castillo holds both bachelor's and master's degrees from St. Mary's University in San Antonio and a doctoral degree from the University of Houston. He became UHD's president in 1992, after serving for ten years as president of San Antonio College. During his tenure at UHD, President Castillo has actively positioned the institution as an integral part of the economic, social and civic well-being of the metropolitan area by connecting university courses, outreach and programs to real needs in the area.

Castillo has held leadership positions on the Commission on Minorities in Higher Education of the American Council on Education, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and has served on the board of the American Council on Education (ACE), and the International Association of University Presidents (IAUP).

Linda Buchman

Community Relations Officer, Spring Branch ISD

Linda Buchman is the Community Relations Officer for Spring Branch Independent School District (SBISD). Her responsibilities include leadership, visioning and oversight for the districts communications, partnerships and volunteer programs, parent engagement and education and community education initiatives. As coordinator for the district's first GEAR UP grant program in 2002, Linda launched the district's SpringBoard mentoring program with 20 mentors in two high-need SBISD middle schools. From that humble beginning, under Linda's leadership the SpringBoard mentoring program now engages over 600 mentors working with students across 24 campuses. The program has earned the 2005 Civic Star Award for the State of Texas, and in January, 2009 was named the Texas Association of Partners in Education Crystal Award winner for top mentor program in the state. The SpringBoard mentor program is featured in the Texas GEAR UP toolkit of promising mentoring practices that was also released in January. Additionally, Spring Branch ISD's Collegiate Challenge Mentoring program aimed at helping minority and low income students through the college application and scholarship process has been named a Texas High School Project Exemplar Program as well as a Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board STAR Award winner.

In addition to her passion for mentoring, Ms. Buchman also serves on the boards for the Southwest Regional Office and the National Board of the Anti-Defamation League, the Spring Branch Education Foundation, the Spring Branch Family Development Center and several other local non-profits and chambers.
